CONGRATS PIERRE!

After 35 years leading Franco-Nevada, Pierre Lassonde – founder of the Lassonde Entrepreneur Institute – retired from the company when he stepped down as chairman of the board in 2020. The milestone concluded an epic career with the company he cofounded in 1985 and grew to its current valuation of \$38 billion.

Franco-Nevada is a leading gold-focused royalty and streaming company. Since its initial public offering (IPO) in 2007, Franco-Nevada's share price has outperformed both gold and other gold equities, and the company has been able to increase dividends for 12 consecutive years. Total shareholder return in the past 12.5 years has been 1,485% for a compounded return of 25.1% per year.

"After 35 years with Franco-Nevada, in one incarnation or another, I would like to thank all of the analysts, brokers, portfolio managers, and shareholders who have believed in us and helped us build this great company," said Mr. Lassonde in his last address as chairman before taking on the title of chair emeritus.

"At a time when financial markets are racked by uncertainty, volatility, and violent losses in the face of COVID-19, there is nothing that gives me greater pleasure than to see our share price reach new highs and give our thousands of shareholders that extra support and comfort they deserve by having invested in Franco-Nevada," he added. "That, more than anything else, is reward enough for me. Thank you."

Mr. Lassonde and partner Seymour Schulich founded the original Franco-Nevada, developing it in the early 1980s to an initial capitalization of \$2 million. In the process, they pioneered the concept of mining royalties. The company remained the leading public mining royalty company until 2002, when Newmont Mining acquired it for \$2.5 billion.

The original Franco-Nevada team continued to manage royalty assets as part of Newmont Capital. In 2007, they incorporated a new Franco-Nevada after launching an IPO and acquiring a royalty portfolio from Newmont for \$1.2 billion. Franco-Nevada now trades under the symbol FNV on both the Toronto and New York stock exchanges.

Mr. Lassonde founded what is now the Lassonde Entrepreneur Institute in 2001. His initial vision was to create an entrepreneur center that would provide transformative experiences by bringing students from all disciplines together to collaborate on new initiatives, technologies, and companies. That vision has grown to reach thousands of students, and Mr. Lassonde has continued

his support as the institute's lead sponsor and visionary. His generous donations support programs, scholarships, and Lassonde Studios.

He was born in Quebec. After receiving a degree in electrical engineering in Montreal, he attended the University of Utah with his late wife, Claudette, and received his MBA in 1973. Since then, he has become a world-renowned mining investor and entrepreneur. Among many other accomplishments, in 1990, Mr. Lassonde authored "The Gold Book: The Complete Investment Guide to Precious Metals."

Beyond his many professional accomplishments, he is a leading philanthropist in areas including education and the arts, he holds seven honorary Ph.D.'s from universities including the University of Utah, and he was made a Member of the Order of Canada in 2001.

OUR HISTORY



2001 — The Pierre and Claudette McKay Lassonde New Venture Development Center forms with a \$100,000 gift from Pierre Lassonde. The center brings together business, engineering, and science graduate students with university faculty inventors to develop commercialization plans.



2002-2003 — The first companies launch from the Lassonde New Venture Development Center. Those companies were in industries including medical imaging and pharmaceuticals.



2008 – The Pierre Lassonde Entrepreneur Center finishes renovation on what is called the "Lassonde House," a historic building in the Fort Douglas area of the University of Utah campus. The building serves as the administrative headquarters. The original structure was built during the Civil War.

2010 — University of Utah ranks as the No. 1 university in the country for startup formation based on faculty technologies. The Pierre and Claudette McKay Lassonde New Venture Development Center contributed to this achievement by accelerating the commercialization of faculty inventions.



2010-2012 — The Pierre Lassonde Entrepreneur Center continues to grow with the addition of new programs, including the Foundry, a business discovery center, Bench to Bedside, a medical-device competition, and the Lassonde Social Entrepreneurship Program.

2006 — The Lassonde Family Foundation gives a \$13 million gift to create the Pierre Lassonde Entrepreneur Center. The gift expands the organization's reach to include competitions with awards of \$100,000 provided by Zions Bank.

2019 — The David Eccles School of Business and Lassonde Entrepreneur Institute add a first-of-akind Master of Business Creation degree and the Lassonde+X program for all undergraduate students to learn the entrepreneurial mindset.



2020 — The Lassonde Entrepreneur Institute moved all its events and activities online for the summer to help students entrepreneur from home during the pandemic.


LIVE AT LASSONDE

DECHEQUE

PROGRAMS: LASSONDE 400 HIGH SCHOOL UTAH ENTREPRENEUR CHALLENGE
INDUSTRY: FINANCE

Decheque is a studentrun startup aiming to change the alternative investment industry. Started in March 2019, Decheque matches investors with hedge funds in hopes of increasing access to the private investment industry. The founder, Andrew Pignanelli, a finance major at the University of Utah's David Eccles School of Business and resident at Lassonde Studios, has been trading stocks for 3 years.

The idea came up after a friend, a hedge fund manager, was discussing the issues with running a hedge fund. "I went up and talked to him, and he started telling me about all these problems with raising money," Pignanelli said.

Decheque uses an algorithm to match

investors with funds. They then give each pair a compatibility score, to better facilitate the best connections. "We're essentially building a dating app," Pignanelli said. "When signing up you're asked all of these questions. Things like risk tolerance, investment focus, financial goals."

Motivational interviewing is an evidence-based approach used by counselors, educators, medical professionals, correctional officers, and others to change patient or client behavior. It can help people smoke less, exercise more, follow through with recommendations, keep commitments, and more.

A team of faculty, professionals, and students at the University of Utah hope to make motivational interviewing training more common and accessible through a new online training platform and company. They launched their product, Enhanced Motivational Interviewing. and their company, eSym, in 2019 and already have clients.

The development and launch of the company was supported during the 2018-19 academic year through the Lassonde New Venture Development Center, which matches graduate students with faculty inventors and industry partners to develop business ideas.

TrailRax provides USAmanufactured, roof-rack equipment, and storage solutions. "From Jeep Wranglers to all mid-sized trucks and more, our

products help customers better their experience with equipment to keep them safe and venturing longer than ever possible," Engelke said.

One of their storage solutions, the Pak Rax, is a side-mounted roof rack that uses dead space on the vehicle for storage space without sacrificing the capabilities of the vehicle. Additionally. TrailRax offers a

customizable foundation of products that allow customers to build their rack how they want it.

Not only does TrailRax assist adventures to the off-roading enthusiasts who go for weeks at a time. but it also caters to the "weekend warrior."

The new nationwide effort is led by Taylor Buckley, a founder in the



VITAPUL INJECTABLES

PROGRAMS: BENCH-TO-BEDSIDE OPPORTUNITY QUEST UTAH ENTREPRENEUR CHALLENGE
INDUSTRY: HEALTH

Vitapul Injectables is on a mission to save lives by improving the treatment of severe allergic reactions. With help from programs at the University of Utah, the student founders are developing a device to inject epinephrine — a drug that narrows blood vessels and opens airways in lungs — in a way that is cheaper and more accessible than existing products like the EpiPen.

Recently, EpiPen manufacturers have been questioned due to rising prices and limited pharmacological changes, causing some people's health to be at risk, according to the student team

The team consists of University of Utah medical students Suzanna Ohlsen, Brian Parker, Trent Perry, Alejandro Blitch, and Teryn Holeman, and MBA graduate Alex Huhn. They believe they can make a better product by separating the active ingredient, epinephrine, in a powdered or "dust" form until just before injection. The uniqueness of this product is in the company's name – "vitapul" is Latin for "bringing dust to life."

For Samery Moras, the founder of Live Martial Arts, martial arts aren't just a hobby — they're a part of who she is. "I was literally born into the world of martial arts," she said. Her family owned a martial arts studio, and from a young age, Moras was inundated with martial arts. "I learned how to kick before I could even walk," she said.

Soon, Moras traveled the world as a competitive martial artist, and was a member of Team USA for six years. Moras began using the internet to share her experiences. "While competing, I would film videos and post content online," she said. "I started to see this opportunity to teach people all over the world just from my YouTube channel."

Moras has gained a dedicated audience for her content. She now has more than 200,000 subscribers and followers on social media. Moras came to the Master of Business Creation program at the University of Utah's David Eccles School of Business to make her content more profitable.

When Aaron Dobron entered the Master of Business Creation (MBC) program at the University of Utah's David Eccles School of Business, he knew that he had a great business idea. Dobron is the cofounder of ArtCiel, which he describes as a "brand-new, state-of-theart technology." ArtCiel uses vertical wall printing to allow consumers to apply images and graphics

directly onto wall surfaces, whether it's drywall, glass, brick, or cement. As an undergraduate at the University of Utah, Dobron studied material science engineering and multidisciplinary design. He used this background to develop ArtCiel, and he also was involved in the Company Launch program, Rush to Revenue, and GetSeeded Program at the Lassonde Entrepreneur

Institute. Entering the MBC program, Dobron wanted to make his company more marketable.

Spencer Wilson and Morgan Lander, University of Utah students and founders of Little Wanderers Studios, have been so impacted by the entertainment and arts industry, they created a company and culture that aims to "uplift the world."

Little Wanderers Studios is an indie game company that celebrates diversity of thought through the creation of fun and entertaining experiences that promote awareness and critical outlooks on the world. They do this through games that are created for everyone.

"Being a woman in the gaming industry and as a gamer myself, I do not see myself recognized in this industry," Lander said. "Going beyond that, Spencer and I began to think about how the other communities, such as

LGBTQ, people of color, and those who do not fit inside the lines of a typical gamer, are very much underrepresented."

Both Founders are in the Entertainment Arts & Engineering program at the U. They are also part of the Lassonde 400 community, living at Lassonde Studios.

Have you tried the acai? University of Utah finance students Nate Berger and Seth Neeleman opened Simply Acai in August 2019. During fall 2019 and beyond, you can find them in the mobile kitchen in the Miller Cafe at Lassonde Studios.

The inspiration started for Neeleman when he was living in Brazil. "I ate acai three to four times a week and loved it." he said. When he came back to the U.S., he wanted to see how he could bring this super fruit here. "After living as a first-year resident at the Lassonde Studios, and after talking to individuals at the Lassonde Entrepreneur Institute, Simply Acai was shortly created," he said.

Simply Acai is focused on premium organic acai imported directly from Brazil. "Acai is the only fruit in the world with no sugar in it," Neeleman said. Berger added, "Our acai is simply acai; there are no add-ins, sugar, or juice."

In addition, the blended acai is topped with fresh fruit, granola, and honey. The acai bowls are sold directly to students at the University of Utah.

Sawtooth started after DJ Potter went on a camping trip to the Sawtooth Mountains. During a rainstorm, all of his gear got soaked and muddy because he didn't have a cover on his truck bed. When he returned home, he searched for a solution, couldn't find one, and eventually arrived at a novel idea: a new type of tonneau, or truck bed cover, that stretches to fit

the size and shape of your cargo.

Fast forward to today, Potter is now in the Master of Business Creation program at the David Eccles School of Business with patents pending on this and another product for cars. "With Sawtooth you can load more, haul more, and do more," he said. Potter is now on his way to growing a \$30 million company within five years. "While in the MBC program I have gained additional tools and skills that have allowed me to look at business and, more specifically, my startup with a critical eye," he said.

While participating in the inaugural year of the Master of Business Creation program from the Department of Entrepreneurship & Strategy at the University of Utah's David Eccles School of Business, doxy. me was able to facilitate millions of virtual meetings for healthcare providers and patients during the pandemic and make significant improvements

to its telehealth platform.

Doxy.me provides a simple, free, secure, and HIPAA-compliant telemedicine solution.

The company was already growing before the pandemic, but demand accelerated substantially as regulations and behaviors changed to embrace remote health services.

Early in the pandemic, doxy.me saw a thousand-

fold increase in demand and quadrupled its staff, growing to serve some 274,000 providers and 6 million patients in March 2020 alone.

Colleagues Dylan Turner and Schuyler Welch joined the Master of Business Creation program with a full scholarship to grow and scale the company.
